

In Their Words: 'Psychic moments' showcased

Cyndee Pawliczek seeks to use her powers for good

Cyndee Pawliczek of Florida has a frequency on the psychic hot line. She is known professionally as Psychic Cyndee on a local radio show and with her clients. She doesn't use a crystal ball or other props; she says her abilities are a gift.

I've been psychic as long as I can remember. I was born in Middletown and bred in the Village of Florida. I went to parochial schools my entire life and graduated from John S. Burke Catholic High School.

I remember telling my mother and grandmother things that simply amazed them. If anyone misplaced something, I could find it. I told them things that eventually came true. And I could stand next to a radio that was turned off and know exactly what was being broadcast. People were astounded and said, "How does she know these things?"

As I got older, my family told me to keep my abilities quiet because other people wouldn't understand them and might become frightened.

I do showcase my psychic abilities on my radio show, "Psychic Moments With Cyndee," which is broadcast on WTbQ in Warwick every Wednesday night at 6. I have a private practice, but I have helped the police on a number of missing person and murder investigations. Working anonymously and from behind the scenes helps ensure my safety.

What callers want to know

On my radio show, I am asked a lot of money-related questions. The economy is on everyone's minds these days, so people want to know if they will keep their jobs, get raises, sell their houses and things of that nature. Then I get a lot of really personal health-related calls. If I pick up a vibe that something bad is going to happen, I'm not going to broadcast that over the air. I'll tactfully tell that person to call back so we may talk privately.

I communicate with those who have died or crossed over, too. I do channeling, but it's nothing like what Whoopi Goldberg did in the movie "Ghost." I do believe that type is possible, but it can really mess up the medium physically. I am a full-trance psychic medium and clairvoyant. Communication comes through me from my higher frequency and I use spirit guides. Sometimes a spirit's presence is ushered in by the smell of roses. Sometimes it can be a quick chill. At other times it's an innate knowledge that something supernatural is present.

Children are usually pretty good on picking up on a spirit's vibe because their minds are unfettered with the adult issues that block the energy flow. In fact, we all have psychic abilities that usually

remain dormant. The mind is an amazing thing and we're all connected to the same Divine Spirit that dispenses that energy freely. This energy is as real as the electrical kind.

We can even communicate with animals by using mental telepathy. Animals can sense danger and know when something catastrophic is going to happen, such as a flood, a storm or an earthquake. With practice, we can be more in tune with our spiritual selves and the ability to connect to the Higher Power.

Sure, there are a lot of charlatans and rip-off artists out there. But I do not prey on the bereaved and vulnerable. I do what I do, and charge reasonable rates for it. And I've never had any complaints.

Cyndee's predictions

As for predictions, I've been right about a great many things. If I'm not sure about something, I simply will not speak of it.

Here a few updates and new predictions: There will be an earthquake in Rockland County in 2018. There will be a resurgence of the H1N1 virus in two or three years and the virus will be twice as powerful as it was in 2009. And there will be an enormous earthquake in Manhattan around 2028, as well as a huge earthquake in Long Island in 2023. The aftershocks of an earthquake in Albany in 2021 will be felt in Orange County and Poughkeepsie. I see the Newburgh-Beacon Bridge swaying. Lastly, a war with Iran will begin in 2016.

Listen, I'm not all about gloom and doom. Finding missing children, working with parents whose children have crossed over and hopefully warning people about Earth changes and natural disasters gives me a sense of purpose. And I have a family like everyone else. My only son attends college in Albany, and I care about what goes on in the world for his sake, and mine as well.
